TRAINING PATHWAYS

A VET pathway provides you with a range of career and learning opportunities and is an excellent segue into a job, further training or university entry.

Certificate I and II qualifications can give you an advantage when applying for jobs that support you whilst you are studying for your WACE and any VET training or university studies after you have left school.

A VET qualification at Certificate III or IV provides a direct job outcome as well as making you competitive for entry into further VET courses after you leave school.

A Certificate IV may also be used as alternative entry into university. Look for information on university websites about their alternative and flexible entry options.

If you start your qualifications in the trades in Years 11 and 12, this means that you will get a head start on being a qualified tradesperson compared to your peers that commence once they have left school.
