What are Contributions & Charges?

Byford Secondary College is dedicated to providing a quality education for your child and a pathway to a successful future.

The Government provides funding to cover the cost of staff, facility maintenance and basic resources with funding dependant on various factors such as student numbers, socioeconomic factors of the area and student characteristics. At Byford we enrich the educational experience with funds collected through the Voluntary Contributions and Charges.

Funds collected from College families are spent on a range of resources including more specialised equipment and resources aimed at providing educational experiences that prepare students for the world beyond school. We ask that you invest \$235 per year (\$6 a week) to enhance your child's learning opportunities. When our school and community work together our young people are the ones who benefit.

What's the difference between "Contributions" & "Charges"?

Voluntary Contributions are non-compulsory charges that the College can request from parents/carers. These contributions supplement the funding provided by the Government for delivering the core subjects of Maths, English, HASS and Science across Years 7-10; and Physical Education, The Arts and Technologies for Years 7-8. To enable the College to provide up to date resources and equipment across the core subjects, we encourage all parents/carers to pay the voluntary contribution for their student/s.

Charges are compulsory for all elective subjects. These elective subjects are offered by the College at its discretion and therefore are not covered by Government funding. All subject costs for Year 11 and 12 are compulsory charges, however Byford Secondary College's Board has directed our efforts towards keeping costs as low and as equitable as possible. When choosing subjects for upper school during Year 10, the College will ask for a 50% deposit when upper school subjects are selected.



Your Account Explained

Years 7 - 10

We wish to assure parents that all subject costs are approved by the School Board and all costings are accountable to the Department of Education and have been directed towards keeping the costs as low as possible.

Voluntary Contributions Years 7-10:

The School is requesting a voluntary contribution of up to \$235.00 for each student towards the cost of materials, textbooks, services and facilities used by students in the educational program. The payment of these costs will make a significant contribution to the quality of educational programs delivered. There is an expectation that families who can afford to pay the Voluntary Contributions do so. Payment of these costs is Voluntary but encouraged and appreciated.



Voluntary Approved Requests:

To assist in meeting the cost of other services offered to students, the school requests parents to contribute to the below Voluntary Approved Requests:

- Chaplaincy Fund: An individual levy has been requested to support the presence
 of a Non-Denominational chaplain. The Chaplain provides a valuable service to the
 students and their families by encouraging, motivating and inspiring young people
 to be the best they can be and help them through life issues that may threaten their
 potential. This position is solely funded by the community and your donations.
- Information Technology Fund This cost is used towards the resourcing and updating of library and IT materials for all students. It is a valuable resource in assisting your child with their educational programs and having access to the most up to date and modern technology. The Department of Education provides limited funding to provide resources for this centre.
- P&C Contribution The P&C is comprised of voluntary members who make a vital contribution to the school. This contribution enables the P&C to purchase much needed equipment for student's use. The P&C can also support in fundraising for school tours and PBS events.
- Bus Fund An individual levy has been requested to support the College in purchasing and running of the College bus which is used for various excursions throughout the year.
- Library Contribution An individual levy has been requested to support the Library in the acquisition of resources for students to ensure current resources are readily available to supplement present-day curriculum.

Payment of these costs is voluntary, however payment is encouraged and appreciated.

Education Program Allowance (EPA)

Applications close 28 March 2024

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. The EPA will be paid directly to the College and will be applied to voluntary contributions for Years 7 - 10 and compulsory charges for Years 11 and 12. For those parents or carers who elect to allocate their clothing allowance directly to the College these funds will be deducted from the compulsory charges first and then any other contributions and/or charges. The allowances below are available to secondary students providing the eligibility criteria is met.

Eligibility Criteria

Parent or carer must hold one of the following cards:

- Centrelink Family Health Care Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card (blue card only)

The parent or carer must be the holder of a card that is valid during Term 1. The only exception to this is when a student holds a health care card in their name and is declared an independent youth by the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) (e.g. living away from home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age. Applications are made by the parent or carer for students enrolled in Years 7 - 12. Application forms are to be completed at the College during term 1 and close 28 March 2024.







Processing of Payments

These forms are now forwarded electronically to Schools Resourcing and Support Directorate for processing which allows the uniform money to be credited to parent/carers' accounts faster (allow 5-10 working days).

Late Applications

Late applications <u>will only be accepted in extenuating circumstances</u> and must be accompanied with a written explanation OR the student has recently arrived from interstate or overseas and enrolled after the end of first term.

Secondary Assistance Scheme Allowance

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$235.00 EPA paid directly to the College and applied to voluntary contributions for Years 7 - 10 and compulsory charges for Years 11 and 12.
- \$115.00 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/carer or to the College to be allocated towards any additional charges and contributions. These funds can *not* be transferred to the Uniform Shop by the College.

Abstudy Supplement Allowance (ASA)

The ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance is available to valid Department of Human Services (Centrelink) cardholders; this funding supplements the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) ABSTUDY Fees Allowance payment.

Applicants apply through the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) for the ABSTUDY Fees Allowance. A payment of \$79.00 is then made to the College directly by Centrelink.

Furthermore, the College or parent/carer must have received the School Fee Allowance of \$79.00 or \$156.00 from the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) as part of the student's ABSTUDY School Fees Allowance.

Payment of the ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance is made directly to the College and will be applied to voluntary contributions for Years 7 - 10, and charges for Years 11 and 12.

Please note you cannot claim both the SAS and ASA.

Payment of Contributions & Charges

For Years 7-10, charges for electives are required to be paid in full **by the end of Term 1**. High cost courses will incur a 50% deposit prior to the course commencement.

For Years 11 and 12, all charges are compulsory. Charges will depend on the course chosen. Some specific courses will incur higher costs dependent on factors such as texts, subject specific resources, materials, excursions, certificates and work placements. Some high cost courses will incur a 50% deposit upon subject selection. Students involved in work placement must pay the associated fees prior to commencement of the work placement. We reserve the right to place students in lower cost options if charges are not paid.

Uniform Shop

Wearing College uniform is compulsory for all students.

The College uniform has several functions which are centred around student equality and safety. We believe every student should be treated equally and be represented equally. The uniform negates the "have" and "have-not" mentality. It is also a way to identify who should and should not be on the College grounds.

Important Information

A Compassionate View

The College is only too aware that the payment of College contributions and charges can be a burden for some families. Payment plans are available to support parents or carers experiencing difficulties. Ignoring accounts and reminders is unhelpful to all parties. The College is also keen to assist parents or carers in selecting options that they can afford. To this end subject charges will always be provided to parents or carers prior to selection of subjects.

Collection of Contributions & Charges

The College will take a positive approach to collecting contributions from parents or carers of students. In particular, the College will highlight the benefits to students if all parents or carers meet their contributions. The College will actively seek full payment of charges.

- In 2024 a statement will be posted during Term 1. In Term 2 the College will post a reminder notice to show any outstanding balances.
- Compulsory charges unpaid as at the 1 July 2024 may be referred to a debt collection agency unless prior arrangements have been made.
- Outstanding charges are rolled over to the student's record in the following year where applicable.
- Year 11 and 12 high cost subjects will be subject to a 50% confirmation charge during subject selection.
- Where parents with outstanding compulsory charges have failed to arrange and commit to a payment plan, the student may be removed from their chosen elective courses and be placed in a lower cost option. In the case where the unpaid compulsory charges cover the cost of materials for the practical classes, the student may not be able to participate in the practical lessons and will have to complete theory work.

Excursion / Incursion Information

Byford Secondary College uses Compass for our incursion and excursion planning. All information is stored in accordance with the Australian privacy requirements.

Parents and carers will receive an email invitation when your child is scheduled to attend excursions. Parents and carers are able to provide consent, make payment, amend contact details, and medical and allergy information through Compass. Please contact the College on 9526 7700 if you require your username and password for Compass resent to you.

Endorsed Programs

An endorsed program is a significant learning program that has been developed for senior secondary students. The program may have been developed by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority, or it may have been developed by a private provider or a school and subsequently endorsed by the Authority. Endorsed programs can be delivered as part of the school curriculum or as extra-curricular activities. Enrolment in endorsed programs needs to be negotiated with the VET office or Associate Principal and is approved on a case by case basis.

Workplace Learning (ADWPL)

Students from Years 10 to 12 may wish to enrol in Workplace Learning (ADWPL) to gain credits towards their WACE. There are strict reporting requirements that must be met. Students will be required to fully complete the College Logbook/s and Skills Journal/s along with completing mandatory workplace hours.

Byford Secondary College students may participate in activities such **as paid or unpaid employment outside of school hours.** These programs often occur outside of school hours and are referred to as outside of school workplace arrangements. An expression of interest form must be collected from the VET office, all aspects must be completed and approved prior to enrolment.

Byford Secondary College students may participate in **unpaid Workplace Learning during school hours** in some instances. This is often targeted BLOCK release, as part of a VET Qualification. An expression of interest form must be collected from the VET office, all aspects must be completed and approved prior to enrolment.

School Based Traineeship/Apprenticeship students will also be enrolled in ADWPL, this process needs to be negotiated with the VET office and is approved on a case by case basis.

At all times students must meet industry standards and this is the responsibility of students and their caregivers. This may require holding a current White Card, completing Drug and Alcohol testing, presenting proof of vaccination and/or providing appropriate PPE (Personal Protection Equipment).

Voluntary Approved Requests

Library (\$25.00) is used by the College to purchase an expansive range of equipment, books and ebooks. Limited funds are provided for Library resources.

Pastoral Care & Wellbeing (\$25.00) is an integral part of the College's Student Services program, these funds help us to provide additional support such as school chaplain and school social workers.

Information Technology (\$10.00) is required to provide a quality range of IT equipment to enable students to continue to have access to the most up to date and modern technology. The Department of Education provides limited funding to provide resources for this area.

P&C Association (\$15.00) This contribution enables the P&C to purchase much needed equipment for students use. Expressions of interest to join the P&C are welcome, please contact Administration on 9526 7700.

College Bus (\$10.00) This contribution is used by the College to assist with the maintenance of the bus. This allows us to charge the bus out to students at a lower rate through the year for excursions.


