Enrolment into the College is a two-step process. Firstly you need to complete the *Application to Enrol Form (Part A)* which has been included with this letter. This form can also be collected from our College or accessed on our College website at www.byfordsc.wa.edu.au. Secondly if an enrolment application is accepted, you will be provided with *Enrolment Form (Part B)*. Both steps must be completed with all requested supporting documents submitted in order to finalise your child's enrolment at our College. Part A should be completed by the end of Term 2 and Part B by the end of Term 3 to ensure smooth transition into our College for the start of 2024.

Byford Secondary College often communicates with our families through a range of digital means. It is therefore important that you have a current email address which we will ask for during the enrolment process. 

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Applying for Enrolment

How to enrol

Enrolment in a West Australian Public School is a two or three-step process. Parents first lodge an *Application for Enrolment (Part A)* with the school, together with proof of residence in the Local Intake Area (2 pieces) and other requested documentation. If our College is in a position to offer your child a placement, you will be provided with an *Enrolment Form (Part B)* and *Student Health Care Summary (Form 1)*. The enrolment is not formalised until this documentation has been processed. An interview with family may be required.

Parents seeking to enrol their child at Byford Secondary College (Byford SC) need to complete a hard copy or online *Application for Enrolment (Part A)* and lodge it with supporting documentation – see list on back of Part A. The College will advise parents of the outcome of their application in writing as soon as possible. You can access enrolment information and fillable forms by going to our website https://byfordsc.wa.edu.au/.

What is meant by "Local Intake Area" (LIA)?

The Department of Education has designated Byford SC as a local intake school, due to population and resource pressures. This means that to be guaranteed a place at Byford SC you must reside in the Local Intake Area, which is a geographical boundary set around the College. If your usual place of residence is within that area, your children will be automatically accepted into the College.

You can view the local intake area for Byford SC at <u>Byford Secondary College Local Intake Map</u>. Simply zoom or search the map to see if you are located within our boundary.

What is meant by proof of residence?

To be eligible for enrolment at Byford SC you need to reside within the Local Intake Area (LIA) and provide us with proof of your residence. The following documents are required as proof:

One of the following:

- · Current rates notice from the local council; or
- Current lease agreement with a minimum of 3 months remaining; or
- Where the family is building in our LIA, evidence of the construction stage.

PLUS one of the following:

- Current driver's licence; or
- Latest utility bill or connection (gas, power, water or landline phone); or
- Recent Centrelink letter.

Application for Enrolment

Whenever possible parents are required to apply by the closing date in the year prior to attending – first Friday of Term 3. This assists the College with planning, eg. staff employment. Applications may still be made after the closing date and will be considered on a case by case basis, in accordance with the Department of Education's *Enrolment Policy* which can be found at http://www.det.wa.edu.au/policies.

What is the purpose of the Form A?

The purpose of the Form A is to establish:

- 1. The **identity and needs** of the student for whom enrolment is being sought;
- 2. The eligibility of the student to enrol in a Western Australian public school; and
- 3. The **residential status** of the student and hence their eligibility under local intake restrictions to enrol at Byford Secondary College.

Places can only be guaranteed for those students who meet all of these parameters.

Proof of Australian Residency needs to be submitted with the Form A

Students born in Australia:

- A copy of the student's Birth Certificate if at least one parent was born in Australia; or
- A copy of the student's Birth Certificate and Citizenship if both parents were born overseas.

Students born overseas:

- · A copy of the student's Birth Certificate
- Passports of the parents
- Current visa subclass and previous visa subclass (if applicable); or
- If the student holds a bridging visa evidence of the visa for which the student has applied.

Note: Parents are required to notify the school of any changes to a student's Citizenship, i.e. current Visa Sub Class when changing from Temporary Resident to Permanent Resident or where a student becomes an Australian Citizen. A copy of this documentation is required for our records.

How do I submit my Application for Enrolment?

Completed online forms, or clear scans/photos of all documents, can be submitted to the enrolments email (below). Hard copies can be submitted to the College office or mailbox, or posted to:

Bring Your Own Device Requirements

Students will need to have a device in their possession each school day in order to maximise participation in the learning opportunities and activities presented in their classroom.

- Minimum storage of 64GB. If your child is enrolling in media type classes, consider getting a larger capacity device to store recorded video.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Special programs are now open to current Year Six students who will be joining the Byford Secondary College community in 2024. You are invited to apply for one or more of our special programs outlined below. Your child may need to choose only one option if there are timetable conflicts. We anticipate that the Advanced Arts Program will be conducted on an afternoon after school hours. This is to be advised.



Aspire Academic Excellence Program

The **Aspire Program** offers students achieving at a very high level in their school reports academic extension opportunities across the Humanities, English, Mathematics and Science curriculum areas. Operating as distinct class groups in Years 7-10 for students, the Aspire program provides enriched learning experiences that are tailored to develop and advance students' knowledge, understanding and skills in a dynamic, challenging and supportive classroom environment.

Aspire students are provided with specialist learning opportunities designed to advance their academic achievement, including participation in competitions and engagement with subject-specific learning incursions and excursions. Members of the Aspire program also benefit from invitations to attend workshops to further the development of their study skills, time management and organisation, with an emphasis on building social, emotional, physical and academic resilience.

All year 6 students will be tested in their own Primary School class. The highest achieving students will be invited to join the program. These offers will be completed in Term 4. If they are unable to participate on the test day or are from a school not in our local area, arrangements can be made for a 50 minute computerised test, to be facilitated by their class teacher. Further details are on the application form.



Sports Science Programs

Our **Netball and AFL Sport Science Program** has been established to allow students to develop a deeper understanding of the practical and theoretical elements of their sport in a fun and competitive environment. Students who are selected for the program will participate in practical sessions per week with Teachers.

Students who are selected to participate in the program build their fundamental skills and understanding of the game through a high level of match play that leads to participation in inter-school carnivals and specialist school exhibition games. They will also study fitness testing, video analysis of their game play, nutrition for sport, functional anatomy, sport psychology, peer coaching, exercise physiology, injury prevention and basic first aid in relation to the game.

Netball students have the opportunity to go on excursions to watch the West Coast Fever play; coach local primary school students; trial for interschool tournaments such as High School Cup and lightning carnivals, plus go on a camp to Busselton during their final year in the program.



Instrumental Music School Services (IMSS)

IMMS provides the opportunity for students to learn an instrument here at Byford Secondary College. Students that are a part of the program will receive a weekly lesson on their instrument at no cost other than the price of purchasing their instrument. In addition to weekly small group instrumental lessons, students have the opportunity to participate in classroom music and other music enrichment activities such as concerts and events.

Our program allows for students who are already learning an instrument in the IMSS program at primary school to continue with Instrumental Music School Services at College. These students who are already enrolled in the IMSS program at Primary School are not required to complete the aptitude/audition and continue their lessons. In this case please choose: *I am already enrolled in the IMMS program at Primary School* in the application form.

We also offer the opportunity to beginner students interested in learning an instrument and they can apply to commence in Year 7. If you are a new student, please select: *I am new to music, I would like to audition for a position*. Students who are selected into the program are expected to continue their instrument at least the end of Year 10 and will be required to undertake class music every year as one of their subjects. In Year 7 and 8 this will replace other Arts subjects and in Year 9 and 10 it will take the place of an elective.



Advanced Arts Program

The **Advanced Arts Program** is an exciting opportunity for students who are passionate about The Arts to work with like-minded students. If selected, you will be placed into a specific Advanced Arts class for your Arts electives throughout Year 7. As with all other students, you will try Dance, Drama, Visual Art and Media Arts. It is expected that you will select the class as your Arts class elective in Year 8 and beyond.

Reasons for applying include:

- Working with other passionate Arts students
- · Being taught by specialist teachers
- Working towards entering competitions, large projects and showcases
- Developing invaluable collaborative, personal creativeness and problem-solving skills.

Please note: If you are an **Instrumental Music Student**, you are not eligible for this program, as you will already be in a specialist music program.

Application:

- Submit a maximum 200 word personal statement of your passion for The Arts. This can be typed
 or hand-written. What is it that inspires you? What areas of The Arts are you most interested in and
 why?
- Submit one copy of a piece of work that demonstrates your interest and/or creativity in your favourite Arts area. Some examples are:
 - ✓ Dance A short video of your performance
 - ✓ Drama A short video of your performance or your script
 - ✓ Music A short video of your performance, singing or playing an instrument
 - ✓ Media Arts A short video you have shot and edited or a comic you have made.
 - √ Visual Arts A drawing/painting, or a picture of your sculpture
